Royal Northern Sinfonia Visits

Since the last newsletter, we've had three visits from Royal Northern Sinfonia players to both Hawthorn and Bridgewater School. The players have worked with the In Harmony tutors to design a bespoke instrumental workshop, all about what is special about their instrument!

The Lower Strings day in November was all about the responsibility of the bass line, and children at Bridgewater were able to hear a double bassist for the first time.

The Flute day in January focussed on posture, and Charli from Royal Northern Sinfonia gave some excellent advice to the young flautists about the impact of posture on the sound.

The Upper Strings day involved our group working hard on playing beautiful melodies. The children at Hawthorn played an arrangement of Bartok's *Romanian Folk Dance No.5* and were able to follow along to the RNS players. The children at Bridgewater sang in sol fa and played an arrangement of *Jubilate Deo* by Mozart.






Brundibár Festival

In February, children from Year 5 at Bridgewater and Year 6 at Hawthorn were treated to an amazing performance of the opera, Brundibár, at Sage Gateshead. The opera was originally written by Hans Krása (libretto by Adolf Hoffmeister) in 1938 as an entry for a children's opera competition sponsored by the Czechoslovak Ministry of Education. Before a winner could be announced, the country was occupied by Nazi Germany. The North-East based Brundibár Festival, run by Royal Northern Sinfonia violinist Alexandra Raikhlina, is named after this opera, and we're grateful to her for giving these children this opportunity to see such a fantastic show.

Before the performance, each class took part in a workshop by The Holocaust Exhibition and Learning Centre based in Huddersfield, learning about the stories of child refugees from the Holocaust and thinking about the value of precious possessions.

After the performance, the children drew pictures and wrote about what their favourite part of the opera was.



In Harmony Live!

The free In Harmony Live! monthly concert series at Hawthorn Primary School continues to be a great success. In January, a quartet of musicians from Sage Gateshead, including our very own violin tutor Jo Montgomery and viola tutor Chrissie Slater performed a wonderful programme of film music, TV themes and familiar classical pieces that the families really enjoyed.

As a result, one parent has decided she'd like to play the violin and starts lessons after half term!

Later this term, there will be a flute recital by our flute tutor Elise Fairbairn and have more participation for families as we host a ceilidh with other In Harmony tutors making up the band and leading. It's so exciting to bring a wide variety of genres to the families.



Family Music Making

In collaboration with Unlock Music CIC, we're delighted to be running family music making sessions every Monday after school.

There are around 15 families from both Hawthorn and Bridgewater Schools who come along and learn about a variety of different instruments and enjoy working on rhythm and playing the drums together. In exploring the various instruments, the group have been composing different sounds and working with the musicians on call and response techniques.

As well as playing the instruments, they have all had the opportunity to learn how to lead the group, thinking creatively about how to start and stop the sounds.

In the next half term, families will be able to explore other instruments, as the group start to develop a melody section, in addition to the rhythm section.

We're really impressed by their commitment and development to the group, and very much hope they will perform within the 10th Birthday Festival.

Thank you to the musicians at Unlock Music CIC for this brilliant opportunity, it is extremely valuable to the families and brings significant enjoyment every week.

In Harmony is a national programme that aims to inspire and transform the lives of children in deprived communities in the UK, using the power and disciplines of community music-making. In our region, Sage Gateshead works in partnership with Hawthorn Primary and Bridgewater Schools to run In Harmony Newcastle Gateshead. Now in its tenth year, the programme continues to enhance the lives of children through community-based orchestral music-making.

From their very first day in Year 1, children at Hawthorn Primary School and Bridgewater School in Newcastle's West End begin learning an instrument – and the benefits extend far beyond the classroom into the wider community.

The music-making skills, confidence, self-esteem, health, wellbeing and resilience of the children improve through the power and disciplines of ensemble music-making and music being part of daily life. In Harmony helps to build a sense of community and supports parental engagement with the schools - some have been so motivated by their children's development that they are now learning instruments alongside their children.
