- Please return home-school books to school.


<u>Reading</u>


Reading will begin by sending phonics sounds home to practise. These will be sounds that we have already learned at school. Children will begin to receive reading books where children will sound out and read the word.


Please make sure that you practise these sounds everyday and make sure reading books are brought back to school.


