




Reading books

Topic Web

English

This half term, we will be reading: Dogger by Shirley Hughes and Toys in Space by Mini Grey. We will:

- Write about our favourite toy
- Create a missing poster for one of the characters from Toys in Space
- Write a character description for the Hoctopize from Toys in Space
- Re-tell the story of Dogger
- Drama activities linked to the characters in Dogger
- Write sentences including capital letters, fingers spaces and full stops.

Science

Our BIG question: what is it made from?

- Distinguishing an object and the materials from which it is made. Sorting in to groups.
- Identify and name a variety of everyday materials, including wood, plastic, glass, metal, water, and rock.
- Investigate best material for a train track.
- Look into the materials needed for an umbrella.

Computing

We will be:

Creating a simple series of instructions - using left and right. Putting two instructions together to control a programmable toy. Plan and test a Bee-Bot journey.

Record routes and understand forwards, backwards, up and down.

Physical Education (PE)

Our PE this half term will be led by a professional sports coach.

The focus is: Fundamentals, and Throwing & Catching

Spiritual, Moral, Social and Cultural (SMSC. RE. PSHE)

<u>RE</u>— We will be looking at where belong and who looks after us.

<u>PSHE</u>— We will be thinking about our feelings and learning about different types of behaviours. We will also be identifying special people in our lives.

Maths

We will be

- * Focussing on place value within numbers to 10.
- * Reading and writing numerals up to 100.
- * Counting forwards and backwards up to 100.
- Identifying one more and one less than a given number up to 10.
- Exploring groups and making comparisons between numbers.

Humanities

(Geography, History, Global Learning)

Through our 'toys topic,' we will be looking at old and new toys and placing these changes on a time-

We will also be identifying and comparing materials of old and new toys and discussing how toys have developed over the years.

Art and Design

We will be:

- Exploring line and shape using pencil by sketching self-portraits.
- We will be exploring colour and colour changes using paint.
- We will look at the work of Wassily Kandinsky and use it to inspire our own versions. Parents will be invited in.
