Predict what could happen from what has been read so far.

Infer from what is being said and done

Book Talk

Ask and answer questions about a range of different texts which are listened to or read, taking turns and listening.

Text Knowledge

Listen to different text types which are listened to.

Discuss the sequence of events

Know and retell more stories

Read some non-fiction texts.

Identify repetition and common phrases.

Fluency

Read quickly and accurately, without lots of blending.

Re-read if something doesn't make sense

Read word endings, like -es

Vocabulary

Use knowledge of other words to work out what a word means.

Recite some poetry with some appropriate intonation to make the meaning clear.

Explain and discuss texts read and listened to.

Physical Education (PE)

The focus for our PE lessons are:

Fundamentals & Team Building

Spiritual, Moral, Social and Cultural

In RE we will be:

- Learning that Jesus told stories to teach people about God
- Identifying the key concepts and ideas in the stories
 Jesus told
- Understand that stories contain inner meanings and messages

In PSHE we will be:

- Constructing a set of classroom rules together
- Identifying the different contributions that pupils make and how this affects the classroom

Humanities

We will be:

- Using world maps, atlases and globes to identify the UK and its countries, as well as continents and oceans that are around us.
- Naming countries of the world and learning that the world is made of many countries.
- Locating the seven continents and five main oceans of the world.
- Begin to use compass directions (N, E, S, W)

Art and Design

We will be:

- Experimenting with mixing primary colours to create secondary colours.
- Use a range of brushes successfully
- Look at the work of David Hockey and recreate an image in his style

Maths

We will be:

- Focussing on place value within numbers to 100
- Reading and writing numerals up to 100
- Partitioning numbers
- Continuing to count in 2s, 5s and 10s
- Beginning to count in 3s and spot patterns
- Revisit number bonds to 10 and look at number bonds to 20
