<u>Uniform</u>

A reminder about uniform expectations as we are noticing more children coming into school without black school shoes.

Our uniform is: a navy blue sweatshirt/cardigan, dark trousers or skirt, with a white polo shirt. Year 6 children wear a white shirt with a tie.

Sensible black shoes must be worn at all times. School PE shoes or trainers are needed for PE days. Headscarves need to be plain navy or black and should be the pull on type or style to make it easy for the children to remove these for P.E lessons. The only items of jewellery allowed are a wrist watch and small simple round stud earrings (these need to be removed for P.E). Hooped earrings should not be worn.
