












It's Getting Colder —Reception Class

<p>Go outside and find five different leaves. Why are some brown? Why are they changing colour? Can you draw a picture of Autumn?</p>	<p>Make a vehicle using recyclable materials, upload a photo of it to Tapestry.</p> 	<p>Look for things in your home that are pairs. Same, same! (Pairs of socks, shoes) Write a list of what you found.</p> 
<p>Order your toys in size order:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Smallest to largest; • Largest to smallest <p>Write what your biggest and smallest toys are</p>	<p>Watch the story 'Owl Babies' on YouTube. Make a wanted poster for Mummy.</p> 	<p>Go for a walk to the woods —describe it using your senses.]What animals live in the woods?/forest? Draw and write a list of the animals.</p>
<p>Go outside on a mini-beast hunt. Choose a mini-beast to research. What does it look like? What does it eat? Where does it live? Make a poster.</p> 	<p>Choose your favourite story book from home, draw a picture of your favourite page.</p>	<p>Find some different flowers. Use your sketching skills to draw them. Can you show some in black and white and some in colour?</p>
<p>Make a weather report for each day you are at home. Draw the weather and write a sentence to describe it.</p> 	<p>Write a list of your favourite colours. Find things around your home or garden that are these colours.</p> 	<p>Write a list of things around your home that are: Circle, square, triangle, rectangle, oval.</p> 
<p>Make a fruit kebab. Write 4 instructions about how you do it. Why is fruit good for you? What foods are not good for you?</p> 	<p>Use the alphabet and find things around your home that begin with that letter.</p> 	<p>Can you make a pitta bread pizza with a grown up? Can you write instructions explaining how you made the pizza?</p>
