

# Topic—Space

Here is a suggestion of some activities linked to what your child has been learning at school. We hope you have fun completing them together.

Draw/Design a new planet. Think about: Who lives on your planet? What does your planet look like? What is it called? Is your planet hot or cold?	Make an invitation to invite your friends to visit the moon.	Look at Earth: Go for a walk and describe, using your senses, all the different things you can see.
Look at the amount of stars in the sky over a few nights and record how many stars you can see each night.  Which night had the most/least amount of stars?	Create a wanted poster for the aliens living on the moon.	Create your own space scene.
If you have internet access, choose a planet to draw and write about. Read your favourite book to an adult/friend/buddy.  Write about <b>WHY</b> it is your favourite book. Would you recommend it to a friend?
Write a postcard/letter from space.	Create a map to help Bob (from the story Man on the Moon) find his way back home from the moon.	Design and make your own rocket.  Can you write instructions explaining how you made the rocket?
