It's instrumental!

Back in 2012, when the In Harmony project received its first tranche of funding from Arts Council England, most of the money was used to buy a large bank of instruments – strings, brass and wind – enough for every child in the school. It was an amazing (and slightly chaotic!) day when the delivery van arrived with them all.

Since then, your donations have been helping with their ongoing upkeep, including providing new strings. Rising pupil numbers at Hawthorn Primary have also meant extra instruments have been needed to ensure every child has access to an instrument. Some of these have been purchased while others have been generously gifted to In Harmony by the public.

Recently, In Harmony's Activity Producer Lorna Wright was contacted by Friends of Royal Northern Sinfonia member Anne Creedy (both pictured right), with the offer of two violins one a ¹/₂ size, the other a ³/₄ size. They had belonged to Anne's daughter Imogen, who came through Sage Gatsehead's Centre of Advanced Training for talented musicians and is now studying music performance at Leeds University. Anne was keen to help other young players develop their talents and was delighted to hear that both donated violins had been put to good use the very next day!
