Welcome back!

As you will likely be aware, the Prime Minister has announced that all school-age pupils will return to school from 8th March. We would like to take this opportunity to outline our arrangements for full opening prior to this date.

All pupils will be expected to attend on-site provision from 8th March, with the exception of pupils following public health advice, e.g. if they are required to self-isolate or shield.

<u>Attendance</u>

From 8th March, attendance is mandatory for all pupils, and the usual rules for attendance apply. Please call the office before 8:50am if your child is going to be off poorly. We will resume our usual attendance monitoring procedures on return.

If your child is following public health advice, e.g. if they are required to self-isolate, are shielding or have coronavirus, you will not be penalised for any non-attendance. Pupils not attending for these reasons will continue to receive remote education, where appropriate.

Protective measures

We want to reassure you that the school has implemented a number of protective measures to keep your child safe upon their return to the school site. We have updated our risk assessment to reflect any changes in line with government guidance to ensure we can welcome all pupils back safely. We will communicate any future changes to you as and when we make them. An updated risk assessment is available to view on our school website. In order to help us in minimising risk of infection, please ensure your child is only bringing essential items to the school site each day, including:

- Lunch boxes
- Hats and coats
- Book bags

Please do not allow your child to bring in pencil cases or stationery items into school as these are all provided. We have a limited amount of storage within school and we are trying to reduce unnecessary items being brought into school. Every child was issued with a book bag and this should be used for homework, reading books and letters/ permission slips rather than bringing large back packs into school.

If your child usually brings a packed lunch into school this should be in a standard packed lunch bag. There is no need to bring large back packs into school.

We will still be operating staggered start and finish times to minimise any unnecessary contact between parents and pupil groups. Only <u>one adult</u> should accompany children to the school gate and we would kindly ask adults to also wear face coverings during these times and when visiting the school office.
